This was also the period of the sad commentary regarding the displacement of the native Indian nations as they were crowded out of their homeland and eventually placed on reservations while the descendants of the

migrating settlers continued to move on west as the new land opportunities became available. buildings. But most of all they left behind the vast amount of historic records, which were used to document the accounts of this story.
