The Child Interview. Practice Guidelines Before interviewing any child about any topic, remember first and always that they are children. You should avoid re-traumatizing a child at all costs. Your tone, the type of questions you ask, and even your posture

(don't talk down to kids, for instance, instead kneeling to their level) can have a negative impact on kids. Conducting interviews with kids: Do's and don'ts ... You can begin the interview by asking specific questions to which the child already knows the answers. This will reduce the child's anxiety level. Beginning questions can be in regards to the child's school, age, etc. As the child begins exploring, you can then begin to ask the child to tell you some things about the child's

life.
