Time Expressions with Reported Speech  
Sometimes when we change direct speech into reported speech we have to change time expressions too. We don't always have to do this, however. It depends on when we heard the direct speech and when we say the reported speech.  
Reported speech - statements with expressions of time ...  
Time and place must often change when going from direct to reported speech. In general, personal pronouns change to the third person singular or plural, except when the speaker reports his own words:  
I/me/my/mine,  
you/your/yours =  
him/his/her/hers

we/us/our/ours,  
you/your/yours =  
they/their/theirs
