The Argentine scholar Noé Jitrik has long been one of the foremost literary critics in Latin America, noted not only for his groundbreaking scholarship but also for

his wit. This volume is the first to make available in English a selection of his most influential writings. These sparkling translations of essays first published between 1969

and the late 1990s reveal the extraordinary scope of Jitrik's work, his sharp insights into the interrelations between history and literature, and his keen awareness of the specificities of Latin American literature and its relationship to European writing. Together they signal the variety of critical approaches and vocabularies Jitrik has embraced over the course of his long career, including French structuralist thought, psychoanalysis, semiotics,

and Marxism. The Noé Jitrik Reader showcases Jitrik's reflections on marginality and the canon, exile and return, lack and excess, autobiography, Argentine nationalism, the state of literary criticism, the avant-garde, and the so-called Boom in Latin American literature. Among the writers whose work he analyzes in the essays collected here are Jorge Luis Borges, Esteban Echeverría, Domingo Faustino Sarmiento, José Martí, César Vallejo, José Bianco, Juan Carlos Onetti,

José María Arguedas, Julio Cortázar, and Augusto Roa Bastos. The Noé Jitrik Reader offers English-language readers a unique opportunity to appreciate the rigor and thoughtfulness of one of Latin America's most informed and persuasive literary critics.

Como señala Ariel Dorfman, La autopista del sur

constituyó una advertencia acerca del despeñadero hacia el que nos dirigíamos, y esa crítica a la tecnología se vuelve hoy aún más válida y necesaria, ahora que la globalización es el dogma indiscutible de la época. Jean-Luc Godard se inspiró en este fantástico relato para realizar su película *Weekend* (1967). *All Fires the Fire* Duke University Press Marxism has had an enormous impact on literary and cultural studies, and all those

Poe

(1809-1849). Poe and Place argues that “place” is an important critical category through which to understand this classic American author in new and interesting ways. The geographical “places” examined include the cities in which Poe lived and worked, specific locales included in his fictional works, imaginary places featured in his writings, physical and imaginary places and spaces from which he departed and those to which he sought to return, places he claimed to have

gone, and places that have embraced him as their own. The geo-critical and geo-spatial perspectives in the collection offer fresh readings of Poe and provide readers new vantage points from which to approach Poe’s life, literary works, aesthetic concerns, and cultural afterlife.

Après une introduction générale qui indique les grands courants de la littérature ibéro-américaine, on aborde l'étude des littératures de tous les pays d'Europe et d'Amérique de langues espagnole et portugaise. Pour chaque pays, on trouve une introduction, des textes choisis et une bibliographie. Cet ouvrage (1) est le résultat d'un travail d'équipe auquel

ont participé des universitaires, des critiques et des écrivains français et ibéro-américains. Ce manuel répond à un besoin croissant de connaître et d'étudier la littérature ibéro-américaine de notre temps. Il est destiné aux élèves de classes terminales des lycées et aux étudiants d'université. Il comporte une Introduction Générale qui indique les grands courants de la littérature ibéro-américaine, et une présentation des littératures de tous les

pays d'Europe et d'Amérique de langues espagnole et portugaise. Il fait une place à des littératures habituellement ignorées, comme celles d'Amérique Centrale ou des Caraïbes. Pour chaque pays, quelques pages d'introduction ont pour tâche d'expliquer les liens entre l'histoire contemporaine et la création littéraire. A la suite de ces pages d'introduction, les étudiants et les professeurs trouveront pour chaque pays une

bibliographie sommaire et un certain nombre de textes choisis. Chaque texte est précédé d'un bref commentaire permettant de le situer dans l'œuvre de l'auteur. Le critère qui a présidé au choix est avant tout le caractère actuel de l'oeuvre : roman, poésie, conte, et éventuellement, selon le pays, théâtre et essai. On n'a pas oublié les jeunes écrivains de la nouvelle génération qui font une entrée en force dans les lettres ibéro-américaines. En somme, ce manuel constitue une

tentative d'appréhension de l'ensemble ibéro-américain à travers son expression littéraire. L'étude de ces littératures devrait nous amener à mieux cerner le problème suivant : qu'est-ce que le monde ibéro-américain ? (1) Ecrit en espagnol ou en portugais selon le pays étudié.

Some of the most important writers of the twentieth century, including Borges, Cortázar, Rulfo, and García Márquez, have explored ambiguous sites of a disquieting nature. Their characters face merging perspectives, deferral, darkness, or emptiness. Such a space is neither a site of projection (as utopia or dystopia) nor a neutral setting (as the topos). For the characters, it is real and active, at once elusive and transforming.

Despite the challenges of visualizing such slippery spaces, filmic experimentations in Spanish American cinema since the 1960s have sought to adapt these texts to the screen. Ilka Kressner's *Sites of Disquiet* examines these representations of alternative dimensions in Spanish American short narratives and their transformations to the cinematic screen. The study is informed by contemporary critical approaches to spatiality, especially the concepts of

atopos (non-space), spaces of mobility, sites of différance, of a self-effacing presence, and sonic spaces. Kressner's comparative study of textual and cinematic constructions of non-spaces highlights the potential and limits of inter-arts adaptation. Film not only portrays the sites in ways that are intrinsic to the medium, but during the cinematic translation, it further develops the textual presentations of space. Text and film illuminate each other in their renderings of

echoes, gaps, absences, and radical openness. The shared focus of the two media on precarious spaces highlights their awareness of the physical and situational conditions in the works. Therefore, it

vindicates the import of space and dwelling, and the often underestimated impact of surroundings on the human body and mind. Despite their heterogeneity, the artistic

elaborations of these ambivalent atopoi all share a liberating impulse: they assert creative and open-ended interactions with space where volatility ceases to be a negative term.
