During this period, Pierre Laszlo led an academic laboratory and worked also in three different countries: the US, Belgium and France, where he had the opportunity to meet remarkable colleagues. In this book, he recalls his encounters and collaborations with important scientists, who shaped the nature of chemistry at times of increased pace of change,

and collates a portrait of the worldwide scientific community at that time. In addition, the author tells us about the turns and twists of his own life, and how he ended up focusing his research on clay based chemistry, where clay minerals were turned in his lab to catalysis of key chemical transformations. Given its breath, the book offers a genuine information on the life and career of a chemist, and it will appeal not only to scientists and students, but also to historians of science and to the general reader.

du français en milieu anglophone. Province de l'Ouest canadien, le Manitoba présente une population anglophone et une minorité francophone ancienne. Ce livre décrit la variété de français en usage au Manitoba, particulièrement son histoire et son lexique. Cette description se fonde sur une enquête de terrain, dite de 'disponibilité lexicale', dont le but est d'évaluer le vocabulaire actif des jeunes. Conduite en neuf points de la province pendant les années 1990, auprès de 344 écoliers d'une moyenne d'âge de onze ans, notre enquête a rassemblé plus de 130.000 mots (occurrences), généralement concrets, issus de seize champs sémantiques (parties du corps, vêtements, maison, meubles de la maison, nourriture, objets placés sur la table, cuisine, école, chauffage et électricité, ville, village, moyens de transport, travaux des champs et jardinage, animaux, jeux et distractions, métiers). Traitées par un programme informatique spécialement conçu pour cette recherche en statistique lexicale, les données recueillies composent un corpus de

19.250 mots différents, annexés en fin de volume. L'indice de disponibilité de chaque mot a été calculé (fréquence d'un mot dans un champ sémantique donné). Les mots d'indice élevé sont les plus utiles à enseigner et à intégrer dans les dictionnaires. Constituant le 'vocabulaire disponible' au Manitoba, ce corpus lexicométrique peut être abordé selon plusieurs perspectives: lexicologique, sociolinguistique, pédagogique et lexicographique II représente le vocabulaire fondamental d'aujourd'hui et il permet d'analyser ses innovations et ses moyens de défense.
